

African Beads with Kundan: A Royal Mix Across Cultures

In our quest for promoting and understanding ancient craft techniques in India and abroad, JDTI conducted a month long **Craft Based Project** with the students and Ms Adi Cloete a jewellery designer from South Africa. She was at JDTI on a jewellery project sponsored by Commonwealth Arts and Craft Award.

The craft techniques of Kundan from India and Bead work from Africa were studied in detail – the study entailed technical as well as cultural aspects of the



crafts, from their evolution to their present day status. Kundan, meaning pure gold is applied in a unique setting commonly practised in ancient India.

To make it more viable in terms of value and appeal and suit the present day requirements it is combined with both precious and semi – precious gems to make jewellery.

Beads since ages have been used across the world to communicate information about power, religion, cultural experience and identity. Most beadwork in South Africa is worn by women, and is linked to important transitions in their lives.

The jewellery products designed and manufactured include pendants and bracelets.

In January 2005, JDTI with Ficci Ladies Organisation conducted a three days workshop for the benefit of aspiring entrepreneurs.


The topics covered in Gemmology were Gemstone classification - Trade and Technical names & Basic

Each meticulously handcrafted piece is finished to perfection under the guidance of the JDTI faculty ensuring wearability, functionality and a professional finish.



- 2. Art of Illustration The ability to express one's ideas on paper in the form of sketches, renderings & technical drawings.
- 3. Know How of Materials Indepth knowledge of materials used in the jewellery industry both precious & nonprecious.
- 4. **Manufacturing Skills & Techniques** Understanding the technicalities involved and basic skills required in the execution of a design.
- **5. Knowledge of Gemstones** Complete study of identification, grading and setting of gemstones as used in jewellery today.




